Why is UNLV the place for your PGP?

UNLV is an approved Institution of Higher Education (IHE) by the NV DOE. A minimum of 225 CUs is needed for movement upwards. Approximately 180 minutes of "clock" time translates to one CU.



- Because UNLV is an approved IHE, 1 credit earned = 8 CUs. Thus, a 3 credit course completed at UNLV = 24 CUs.
- Non approved IHEs accrue CUs at a slower rate; 1 credit of coursework earned = 5 CUs. Thus, a 3 credit course completed at a non-approved IHE = 15 CUs.
- In addition, credits earned can also be applied to programs of study, i.e., M.Ed., Ph.D., certificates, and endorsements.

All of the following courses are 3 credits or 24 CUs.

Understanding Students & Learning

- **EPY 707 Adolescent Development**
Examines physical, cognitive, social, and moral development of adolescents. Topics include, social relations, aspects of sexuality, and special problems and issues of adolescence with applications to education and student learning.
- **EPY 708 Human Learning and Development**
Introduction to basic concepts in educational psychology with emphasis on development, learning, and motivation as it relates to student learning.
- **EPY 711 Human Growth and Development**
Emphasis on implications of human growth and life-span development (childhood through adulthood) for counseling and instruction.

Academic Interventions for Students with Learning Disabilities

Courses in this sequence are designed to enhance and expand educators' understanding of the design and implementation of intensive, academic interventions for students with learning disabilities (LD) or those who display severe and persistent academic needs. Courses in this sequence run as 8-week hybrid courses.

Behavioral Interventions for Students with Emotional and Behavioral Disorders

Courses in this sequence are designed to enhance and expand educators' understanding of the design and implementation of intensive, behavioral interventions for students with emotional and behavioral disorders (EBD). Courses in this sequence run as 8-week hybrid courses.

Evaluation & Assessment of Learning

- **EPY 709 Classroom Assessment**
Topics include traditional and alternative assessment procedures and the roles of teacher, student and administrators, in interpreting and reporting results.
- **EPY 728 Applied Classroom Research**
The course provides basic knowledge and skills necessary to conduct research within a classroom. Introduces elements required to begin and conduct an action research project, including purpose/rationale, literature review, data collection, analysis and interpretation, and communicating results.

Applied Behavior Analysis & Application in the Classroom

Courses in this sequence are designed to teach educators the underlying principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and its application in the classroom environment. Courses are designed to provide a foundational understanding of ABA for teachers, as well as learn practical strategies and techniques for the implementation of ABA in the school environment. Courses in the ABA sequence run as 3-week (Thursday evening, Friday evening, and Saturday) or 4-week (Friday evening, Saturday) modular courses, or in the summer. Courses in this sequence partially fulfill the coursework requirements for certification as a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA).
