Part 3 UNLV Rebel Academy Bus Contract

The Transportation Department is dedicated to the safety of students. To make each day a success, professionals work together to consistently enforce rules that will enhance and promote a safe atmosphere. These rules listed below are posted in all district school buses and should be acknowledged and followed whenever a student is riding the school bus. Please take a few moments to read and discuss the following rules with your child.

Safety First Rules Parents/guardian, bus drivers, and the school should work together to communicate and enforce the safety rules. Trustworthiness - Be honest Promptly sit in your assigned seat, face forward, and remain seated until the bus arrives at your destination. Respect - Treat others with respect. Fighting, pushing, tripping, kicking or any other acts that cause injury to others will not be tolerated. Additionally, no profanity, name-calling or offensive language are allowed. The bus driver is responsible for the bus and the safety and well being of all students on and around the bus. The school bus is an extension of the classroom and the same rules will apply. Students on the bus are under the immediate supervision of the bus driver. Your cooperation in following the above rules will make your trip safe and fun. Responsibility - Think before you act. Students should arrive at the bus stop no sooner than ten minutes prior to their scheduled pick up time. Only small packages, backpacks, and personal belongings that can be held in your lap are permitted on the bus. No glass containers, live insect/animals or any other unauthorized items are permitted on the bus. Skateboards and roller blades are permitted if stored in an appropriate bag. Instruments or items too large for the child's lap may be permitted depending on space availability. Fairness - Play by the rules. Wait off the street in a single file line until the bus comes to a full stop. Never run alongside a moving bus. Load quickly, quietly, and orderly. No pushing or shoving. There should be no excessive noise or outbursts causing distraction to the driver. At your stop, remain seated until the bus has fully stopped, then go directly to the front exit door. Caring - Be compassionate and show you care. There is no littering, vandalism, or destruction of property. Your parent/guardian may be held responsible for the cost of the repairs. No eating, drinking or gum chewing on the bus. No matches, lighters, tobacco or smoking on the bus. Citizenship - Obey laws and rules. No weapons on the bus or at the bus stop. Do not block the aisle and all body parts must be kept inside the bus at all times.

The following document outlines these rules, the progressive discipline policy, and attendance policy for the summer. The last page requires a student signature, parent signature, and contact information.

Rules and Regulations

CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT REGULATION R-5141.1

DISCIPLINE: CONTROL OF DANGEROUS AND ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOR

- I. The law charges every teacher and administration with maintaining order and discipline among students and provides that students who do not comply with reasonable rules may be recommended for disciplinary action.
- II. Actions taken to control and correct undesirable student behavior should take individual circumstances into account. Concern for the safety and educational welfare of all students must be the major priority.
- III. It is the administration's responsibility to take actions as necessary to protect students and school personnel from dangerous or socially detrimental actions of students.
 - A. Any student who is considered a danger to persons or property may be suspended and removed from school immediately, subject to the following conditions:
 1. The student is given an explanation of the reasons for his suspension and removal,
 2. The student is afforded an opportunity to explain his conduct,
 3. A recommendation for suspension or expulsion of the student is initiated immediately.
 - B. Verbal Abuse, Intimidation, or Cyber-bullying
A student shall not direct harassing, vulgar, or derogatory remarks toward any person, in person or by electronic means. A student shall not willfully or maliciously engage in a course of conduct that would cause a reasonable person to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated or harassed.
 - C. Racial or Sexual Harassment
A student shall not willfully or maliciously engage in either verbal or physical conduct that would cause a reasonable person to feel racially or sexually harassed.
 - D. Physical Abuse on Any Person
A student shall not intentionally cause physical injury to any person, nor intentionally behave in such a way, as could reasonably cause physical injury to any person. Neither reasonable self-defense nor action undertaken on the reasonable belief that it was necessary to protect some other person is to be considered an intentional act under this subsection.
 - E. Violations of Authority and Behavioral Guidelines
A student shall not fail to comply with directions of teachers, student teachers, substitute teachers, teacher aides, hall monitors, deans, school district police officers, administrations, assistant administrations, or other authorized school personnel during any period of time when the student is properly under the authority of school personnel. Students shall comply with the behavioral guidelines that are adopted by each school in

conjunction with the spirit and intent of this regulation. Employees shall ensure that directions given are reasonable.

F. Immoral Conduct

Any student who commits or attempts to induce another student to commit an act or acts of immoral conduct shall be asked to leave UNLVRA. Immoral conduct includes inappropriate, suggestive, or explicit sexual behavior; conduct inconsistent with rectitude, or indicative of corruption, indecency, depravity, dissoluteness; or as willful, flagrant, or shameless conduct showing moral indifference to the opinions of respectable members of the community. If it appears that the law may have been violated, the student shall be referred to the proper law enforcement agency.

G. Theft, Loss, or Destruction of School District and/or Private Property

A student shall not intentionally cause or attempt to cause, or intentionally commit any act that may reasonably be foreseen to cause substantial damage, in any manner, to school district property or to private property located on school district property, or take or attempt to take the property of another.

Parents and students are responsible for instructional supplies and materials loaned to students. Students and their parents shall be held responsible for damage to district property.

Students responsible for damages may be required by the administration to reimburse the district for the loss. In the event of substantial damages (over \$500) a report should be made to the appropriate associate superintendent before the district accepts restitution for referral for legal action to recover the losses. Violations of this subsection do not subject the student to expulsion, unless substantial damage (over \$500), has occurred.

H. Arson

A student shall not intentionally set fire, or attempt to set fire, or intentionally engage in conduct which may reasonably be foreseen to set fire to school district property, nor the property of another, nor shall a student participate in or encourage another person to participate in such conduct.

I. Weapons

1. No person may carry, use, possess, conceal or transmit a weapon, as defined herein below, on school district property except a peace officer, school district police personnel, or a person having written permission from the administration of the school to carry or possess the weapon.
2. Implements manufactured, used, or intended for use as weapons may not be carried, used, possessed, concealed, or transmitted at school on school district property, on the way to or from school, or at or on the way to or from a school activity, function, or event.

Students found in possession of a weapon shall immediately be referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency and suspended from UNLVRA.

3. Weapons are defined as firearms, including but not limited to pistol, rifle, zip gun, shot gun, BB gun, pellet gun, explosive, explosive propellant, destructive device, or ammunition--whether operable or inoperable, loaded or unloaded; knives, including but not limited to switch blade, pen knife, pocket knife, hunting knife, and similar objects; other weapons, including but not limited to razor blades, ice picks, dirks or

other sharp instruments, nunchakus, metal knuckles, pipes, Chinese stars, billy clubs, and machetes; explosive or inflammable material, including but not limited to bombs, fireworks, or firecrackers; or any other items that may cause bodily injury or death. All weapons, whether or not listed herein, are similarly prohibited. The use of any normally nondangerous implement such as a stone, table fork, board, stick, or baseball bat as a weapon, shall come under the provisions of this section.

J. Simulated Weapons

1. No person may carry, use, possess, conceal or transmit a simulated weapon on school district property unless they have received written permission from the school administration, or the administration's designee, to carry or possess such a simulated weapon.
2. Simulated weapons include, but are not limited to, any "toy" or nonfunctional implement which bears a substantial visual resemblance to any item defined by this regulation as a weapon.

K. Drugs, Alcoholic Beverages, Use, Possession, and Distribution

1. Any student who is found in the last 12 calendar months to have possessed, used, sold, or to have in any way encouraged the possession, use, sale by another of any controlled substance including narcotic drugs, prescription or over the counter drugs except in accordance with Regulation 5150 - Health and Welfare, drug paraphernalia or alcoholic beverages or any represented to be a drug paraphernalia, or alcoholic beverage shall be suspended.
2. If it is believed that an illegal act has been committed, the student shall be referred to the proper law enforcement agency.
3. The suspension shall be in effect until it has been determined whether the student is believed to have committed any of the acts listed above.
4. Students who possess, use, sell or encourage others to possess, use or sell drugs or alcoholic beverages are considered a threat to the safety and welfare of other students.

L. Tobacco

Student's use of tobacco on any school campus is prohibited.

M. Robbery/Extortion

A student shall not take or obtain property of another person by means or reason of violence, force, threat of force, coercion, intimidation, fear, passive resistance, or any other conduct.

N. Disruption of School

1. A student shall not by use of violence, force, noise, coercion, threat, intimidation, fear, passive resistance, or any other conduct intentionally cause the substantial and material disruption or obstruction of any lawful mission, process, or function of the school district.
2. Neither shall a student engage in, nor urge, other students to engage in such conduct for the purpose of causing the substantial and material disruption or obstruction of any lawful mission, process, or function of the school district if such a disruption or obstruction is reasonably certain to result from the student's actions.
3. While this list is not intended to be all inclusive, the following acts, when done for the purpose of causing a substantial and material disruption or obstruction of any lawful mission, process, or function of the school district or when such result is a

foreseeable consequence of said conduct, illustrate the kinds of offenses encompassed here:

- a. Occupying any school building, school district property, or part thereof with intent to deprive others of its use.
- b. Blocking the entrance or exit of any school district building or corridor or room therein with intent to deprive others of lawful access to or from, or use of, the building or corridor or room.
- c. Setting fire to or substantially damaging any school building or property.
- d. Firing, displaying, or threatening use of firearms, explosives, or other weapons, or simulated weapons on the school district premises, at a school activity, function or event, or on the way to or from school or a school activity, function, or event.
- e. Preventing or attempting to prevent by physical act the convening or continued functioning of any school, class, or activity of any lawful meeting or assembly on school district property.
- f. Preventing students from attending a class or school district activity.
- g. Except under the direct instruction of the administration, blocking normal pedestrian or vehicular traffic on school district property.
- h. Continuously and intentionally making noise or acting in any manner so as to interfere seriously with the teacher's ability to conduct class.

O. Activities of Criminal Gangs

Students are prohibited from wearing any clothing or carrying any symbol on school district property that denotes membership in or an affiliation with a criminal gang.

Students are prohibited from engaging in any activity that encourages participation in a criminal gang or facilitates illegal acts of a criminal gang.

For purposes of this regulation, a criminal gang is defined as any combination of persons, organized formally or informally, so constructed that the organization will continue its operation even if individual members enter or leave the organization, which; (a) has a common or identifying symbol; (b) has particular conduct, status and customs indicative of it; and (c) has any one of its common activities engaging in criminal activity punishable as a felony.

P. Violation of Law

Violation of any state or federal law in school buildings or on school district property, at a school sponsored activity, function or event, or on the way to or from school or a school activity, function or event, whether or not a criminal citation, arrest, prosecution or conviction results from the violation.

Concurrent penalties imposed by both the district and the appropriate law enforcement agency could result from the violation of this item or any listed above.

VII. Mandatory Expulsion Recommendation

A student who is found to have committed any of the following offenses must be recommended for expulsion from UNLVRA as provided for in the below-listed subsections of Section V:

- A. Assault or Battery on a School Employee;
- B. Immoral Conduct - as it pertains to sexual behavior between individuals;
- C. Arson;
- D. Possession of a Firearm, including a weapon defined by the Gun-Free Schools Act as set forth below, or a Dangerous Weapon, which includes, without limitation, a blackjack,

slingshot, billy, sand-club, sandbag, metal knuckles, dirk or dagger, a nunchaku, switchblade knife or trefoil, a butterfly knife or any other knife described in NRS 202.350, or any other object which is used, or threatened to be used, in such a manner and under such circumstances as to pose a threat of, or cause, bodily injury to a person

E. Drugs, Alcoholic Beverages, Use, Possession, and Distribution as follows:

1. Any sale, distribution, sharing or possession with intent to distribute, any form or amount of drugs or alcoholic beverages.
2. Any possession of drugs or alcohol.
3. In addition, when a violation of law is believed to have occurred, the student will be referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency for prosecution to the full extent of the law.

DRESS AND APPEARANCE

I. Community Standards

The Clark County School District reserves the right to promote that the dress and grooming of students are within the limits of generally accepted community standards. Students shall be required to show proper attention to personal cleanliness. Students have a responsibility to dress in alignment with the Clark County School District dress and appearance guidelines.

II. Educational Environment Standards

Student's dress, personal appearance, and conduct are required to be of such character as not to disrupt or detract from the educational environment of the school. Any style which tends to diminish instructional effectiveness or discipline control by teachers is not acceptable.

III. Responsibility

The school administration shall have the right to designate which types of dress, fashion, fads, or appearance disrupt or detract from the educational program and may be a potential safety hazard. The administration shall retain the authority to grant exceptions for spirit days, special event dress days, and schoolwide free dress days.

IV. Basic Dress Code

The UNLVRA Basic Dress Code serves to provide guidelines for student dress and appearance. Students are to be dressed in such a manner that their appearance in the school contributes to the learning environment.

Exemption from the Basic Dress Code may be permitted for medical or religious reasons.

Basic Dress Code:

1. Require the wearing of shoes with soles. House slippers and shoes with wheels are not permitted.
2. All clothing must be sufficient to conceal any and all undergarments. No skin will show between bottom of shirt/blouse and top of pants or skirts at any time. All sleeveless shirts must have straps at least three inches wide. Prohibited tops include, but are not limited to, crop tops, tank tops, strapless, low-cut clothing, clothing with slits, or tops and outfits that provide minimum coverage.
3. Require that all shorts, skorts, skirts, and jumpers/dresses must be at fingertip length.
4. All jeans, pants, and trousers must be secured at waist level. Sagging is strictly prohibited. Jeans, pants, and trousers are not to have rips or tears that expose undergarments and/or are located mid-thigh or higher.

5. Headgear (hats, hoods, caps, bandanas, hair grooming aids, etc.) is not permitted on campus except for documented medical conditions, bona fide religious reasons, or school sanctioned activities.
6. Slogans or advertising on clothing, jewelry, buttons, and/or accessories which by their controversial, discriminatory, profane, and/or obscene nature disrupt the educational setting are prohibited.
7. Any clothing, jewelry, buttons, and/or accessories that promote illegal or violent conduct, or affiliation with groups that promote illegal or violent conduct such as, but not limited to, the unlawful use of weapons, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or drug paraphernalia, or clothing that contains threats are prohibited.
8. Spiked or studded clothing, jewelry, and/or accessories are prohibited.
9. Outerwear such as coats, mittens, and scarves must be removed upon entering the classrooms/buildings

Progressive Discipline

Should students fail to comply with the aforementioned rules and regulations, the following progressive discipline will be followed:

- 1st offense- verbal warning by the teacher
- 2nd offense- hall conference between the student and teacher
- 3rd offense- phone call home
- 4th offense- referral to the administration
- 5th offense- Expulsion from the UNLVRA

In order to ensure proper progressive discipline, please provide the UNLVRA with updated contact information.

Attendance Policy

As this is a summer program, we understand that students may miss classes for various reasons. However, to ensure that students are rewarded for consistent attendance and participation, students must attend **90%** of the UNLVRA in order to attend the final day trip to Wet and Wild on July 2nd. **Students may miss no more than 2 days in order to attend the field trip.**

Attendance means that students are present for all three of their classes. Three (3) tardies or leaving school early will result in 1 absence.
